- 5. Participation in the PATs and Diploma Exams was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic from 2019/20 to 2021/22. School years 2019/20, 2020/21 and 2021/22 are not included in the rolling 3-year average. Caution should be used when interpreting trends over time.
- 6. Participation in the PATs and Diploma Exams was impacted by the fires in 2018/19 and 2022/23. Caution should be used when interpreting trends over time for the province and those school authorities affected by these events.
- 7. 2022/23 PAT results do not include students who participated in the optionally implemented/piloted curriculum and were excused from writing in those subject areas.
- 8. Security breaches occurred over the last few days of the 2021/22 PAT administration window. Students most likely impacted by these security breaches have been excluded from the provincial cohort. All students have been included in school authority reporting. Caution should be used when interpreting these results.
- 9. Aggregated Diploma results are a weighted average of percent meeting standards (Acceptable, Excellence) on Diploma Examinations. The weights are the number of students writing the Diploma Exam for each course. Courses included: English Language Arts 30-1, English Language Arts 30-2, French Language Arts 30-1, Français 30-1, Mathematics 30-1, Mathematics 30-2, Chemistry 30, Physics 30, Biology 30, Science 30, Social Studies 30-1, Social Studies 30-2.

Commentary and Analysis: Crestwood School continues to maintain high and very high standards in all the above areas maintaining previous results. The development of STEM focused programing through the alignment of impactful instruction and quality evidence of learning will continue to promote strong citizenship, quality education and engagement with all community members. We will continue to focus on restorative inclusive practice, building a sense of safety, belonging and connections to adults in the school to improve a feeling of respect and care in the learning environment.
